What's this about? Lewes District Council is making a new Local Plan. It will shape the physical development of the area between now and 2030. The new Plan is important: it will affect Barcombe, deciding where development will go and

resolving planning applications. The Parish Council would like to know your views on future development.

Where? As part of its statutory plan Lewes District Council has to identify land for enough housing to meet needs up to 2030, based on changes in the population. There are currently around 600 dwellings in Barcombe, and as a parish we are

likely to have to find sites for at least 30 new houses, bungalows or flats over the next 15 years.

whether to prepare a plan specific to Barcombe — a legally-binding Neighbourhood Plan.



Sites currently identified by Lewes District Council for possible future housing development


